

Erhu video notation instructions



- •Follow the yellow dot as it moves up and down the vertical line.
- •The vertical line is the full length of the "A" string on the erhu.
- •The moving yellow dot is the position along the string at which to make contact (pressing down with the finger whilst bowing).
 - •The result is a series of short glissandi fragments at different rates and positions.

Erhu video notation instructions



When the circle on the right flashes yellow bow the erhu and when it is grey be silent. This only applies when instructed to in the staff score.

This doesn't need to be perfectly in time, but an attempt should be made to make a sound when the circle flashes even if there is a delay.
